Cartoon Activity

- 1. Without looking, reach into your envelope and pull out one card. Place it so all group members can observe the card. Use the talking sticks protocol to share out and record 10 (or more) facts or observations about the card.
- See next slide for example

Use talking sticks to share out 5-10 observations



1. Pigs hold flowers
2. Curtains are blue with yellow dots
3. Walls are blue

4. Grandma wears pink PJ'S
5. One pig has checkered shirt / grey pants
6. Other pig has checkered pants / gray shirt
7. Flowers red with yellow middle
8. 6 windowpanes
9. Grandma wears glasses
10. White trim on hat

- Place the card off to the side and draw out the next card, repeat. When you have finished observing your second card place it either before or after your first card depending on where you think it fits with the story. Continue until you have observed all 6 cards.
- Part B
- Work with your cards and put them in order so they tell a story. Base your decisions, as much as possible on the data (your observations).
- As a group, write a story that goes along with your story cards.
- Write your story on a separate sheet of lined paper.

- When you are finished, trade stories with another group and use the talking sticks protocol to discuss the differences and similarities between the 2 stories.
- Last: Individually answer the follow-up questions.
- The “WHY” part of the questions is the most important.
- I want you to think and write about 😊why the 2 stories, with the exact same cards, were different in some ways and why they were similar in some ways.
